Dear brethren,

the Sixth Commandment is: You shall not commit adultery! And our Lord Jesus teaches us that to divorce is to commit adultery - except for those whose marriage has already been broken, that what breaks a marriage is not any and all shortcomings with regards to the marriage, but the actual and outright abandonment of it: You have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not commit adultery.' He says, But I say to you that whoever divorces his wife for any reason except sexual immorality causes her to commit adultery; and whoever marries a woman who is divorced commits adultery. Matthew 5:27, 32

His demand for faithfulness in marriage reflects Gods' own faithfulness to His Word, and to those to whom He binds Himself by His promise. With His promise of salvation in Baptism He binds Himself to His Christians; and His promise is sacred, so that He neither can nor will break it.

This is what His ordinance of marriage as a lifelong union reflects: that God Himself is faithful and will not abandon His promise, not even when His Christians sin against Him, as we all do, and often. And how could He? After all, His salvation *is* the full forgiveness for our sin; how could our shortcomings and sins cancel *that* out?

The history of ancient Israel teaches us this, also. God chose Israel as His people, not because of its own goodness, but out of His own goodness and mercy, and gave Israel His promise that His mercy love would be upon His people, with His blessing.

And Him being faithful to His promise was *not* contingent upon perfect obedience to His Word and will on the part of the people; He dwelt in the midst of the people, with His glory, in the Temple for the express purpose of granting *forgiveness* when they failed.

It was not because of common sins and shortcomings with regards to His Law that God abandoned Israel and gave her over into the hands of her enemies, but rather because the people abandoned His very covenant of mercy, when they ceased to live as His people, neither seeking to observing His Law nor repenting when they fell short. They gave themselves over to the ways of the heathens, and to their gods; and so they not only sinned against His covenant, but broke it, so that it was no longer in place, similarly to how adultery is not only sin, but breaks a marriage. For their idolatry was nothing less than religious adultery: "They broke my covenant though I was a husband to them!" says the Lord. Jeremiah 31:34

Marriage is an imagery of the covenant of salvation God makes with us in our Baptism. Only when he ceases to be a Christian and places himself outside of the covenant - that is: when he ceases to live with God in His Word and worship, and to repent of his sins and seek to overcome them, and lives in instead in disobedience and disregard for the Word of God - only then can a Christian sinner lose his salvation. God is faithful to His promise of salvation; His covenant is sacred also - and in particular! - to Himself.
