#### Dear brethren,

the Sixth Commandment is: You shall not commit adultery! And our Lord Jesus teaches that whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her, and if a woman divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery. Mark 10:11-12

It is common in our day and age to understanding adultery only as infidelity, that is: to have sexual relations with somebody other than your husband or wife while you are married, whereas if you prefer to be with somebody other than your husband and while, and for that reason divorce him or her, and then marry the one you would rather be with, that does not fall under the definition of adultery, and is not in any way problematic. Well, in our day and age, common culture does not consider infidelity necessarily immoral, not in itself, even though it might condemn some other behaviours that will often accompany infidelity, or be displayed in connection with a subsequent divorce. The idea that only the infidelity of someone who is still married is immoral, whereas exchanging your husband and wife for another is not, is one usually found only in church environments. It is taught in churches indifferent to the Word and will of God, sometimes outright, and certainly through their wedding practices, when they celebrate the substitution of one husband and wife for another, and declare the blessing of God to be upon it, as if first having divorced one's wife or husband makes it pleasing to God that one takes another.

What Holy Scripture teaches is that divorce is in itself adultery, because it means breaking the marriage covenant, which is what adultery is. Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her, says our Lord Jesus, and if a woman divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery.

When God forbids adultery, He is not establishing a system of technicalities and hoops one must jump through before one can get rid of one's husband and wife and take another. His Commandment calls for *faithfulness*, nothing less, to Him, and to His ordinance, and to one's husband and wife. His command and ordinance is that those who would be together commit themselves to each other in a covenant of love, and that they do not break that covenant, neither in order to be with somebody else instead, nor for any other reason.

Have you not read that He who made them at the beginning 'made them male and female,' and said: 'For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh'? So, then, they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let not man separate. Matthew 19:3-6

His ordinance is that husband and wife live together, not only for as long as one of them wants to, or both, but all through life, and struggle through whatever temptations and trials may come along *together*, and together with Him, in faith and love.
