Dear brethren,

the Sixth Commandment is: You shall not commit adultery! With this Commandment God states in the negative what He teaches throughout Holy Scripture, mostly in the positive: that marriage should not only be honoured as His sacred ordinance, but also *treasured* and *celebrated*; for His ordinance of marriage is His gift to His most beloved creatures, given to us out of the abundance of His own goodness.

By living together in marriage we, as His most beloved among His creatures, have the privilege of reflecting His own goodness in the created world. God the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, who were together from eternity, united in love, and whose very innermost nature is love, said to Himself, in the beginning, and to each other: Let us make Man in our image, after our likeness. And God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them. Genesis 1:26, 27

We are not made for solitude. Being made in the image of God, we are made to relate to other human beings in love.

Now, this applies not only to marriage: it is in our nature to relate, also, to other human beings than the one to whom we are married, to our children, those of us who have any of those, and our extended families, and friends, and even to more distant acquaintances, and our entire community.

That human beings are not made for solitude is clear also from this: that we are not even supposed to live our life with God on our own, in separation from others, but rather in His Church. This is made quite clear throughout Holy Scripture.

As Christians, and as human beings, we are made to live together with others in love. And although this does not apply only to marriage, it is made manifest in marriage more than in any other human relation. We are by nature inclined to long for intimacy, physically and emotionally, with one particular person of the sex opposite of our own; most of us are. To some of us things happen so that they have come to desire differently, or to be afraid of intimacy altogether. Others have a different calling from God. As our Lord Jesus says it: There are eunuchs who were born thus from their mother's womb, and there are eunuchs who were made eunuchs by men, and there are eunuchs who have made themselves eunuchs for the sake of the Kingdom of Heaven. Matthew 19:12

Made in the image of God, Man is made to live in communities of love; and marriage is not only the most intimate of these communities, but also foundational for the family, which is, in turn, the foundation of all communal living. And made in the image of God, as male and female, the capacity has been given to us of bringing new life into the world out, of our love, as all life came into the world to begin with out of the love of God. And thus to take part in the life-giving work of God is a precious privilege, one to treasure and celebrate. Exceptions aside, it is in marriage that we first and foremost serve God in this world, in accordance with His purpose for us.
